# Affordable housing exec wins state award

Melody Federico & NewBridge honored for providing housing to those in need

Melody Federico, Director of Housing Development at NewBridge, has been named a 2007 Forty Under 40 recipient by NJBIZ magazine for her efforts to provide affordable homes to middle and lower-income families and those with special needs in Morris and Passaic counties.

The Forty Under 40 Award honors men and women who make a difference in their field and who share a commitment to business growth, professional excellence and the community. Winners were highlighted in a special supplement to the October 1, 2007 issue of NJBIZ.

“Ms. Federico is a driving force for affordable housing in Northern New Jersey. At a time when real estate is at its most restrictive, she is using her skill set and keen insight to put

homes into the deserving hands of those who need it most,” said Robert L. Parker, Executive Director, NewBridge.

In just one year, Federico has developed 19 of the 100 units sought by NewBridge before 2010, with 3 more in line before the end of 2007, and another 23 in the development pipeline.

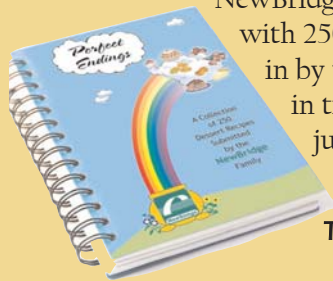
Recent contributions to NewBridge’s affordable housing initiative include \$15,000 from Chase and \$10,000 from WaMu.
