DONATIONS/GRANTS

The trustees of the **Lillian P. Schenck Fund** through PNC Advisors awarded the Southeast Senior Center for Independent Living a grant of \$9,000 to help offset the cost of maintenance expenses at the facility.

Two charitable organizations

received grants from **The Horizon Foundation for New Jersey** during the foundation's fourth round of grants in 2009.

Children's Aid and Family Services in Paramus received a grant of \$25,000 to support its Mobile Youth Support Outreach Project, which assists young adults struggling with their transition from group and family foster homes to independent living.

West Bergen Mental Healthcare in Ridgewood received a grant of \$25,000 to support its Children's Depression Intervention Program, which assesses and treats children and adolescents for depression and integrates family therapy as needed.

The **Community FoodBank of New Jersey's** Kids Division collected and will distribute 816 pairs of pants to area schools via the Tools-4-Schools program or through partner charities, thanks

to the Smarty Pants Thanks for Giving combined effort of Ho-Ho-Kus Third Grade Brownie Troop 1168 and the Ho-Ho-Kus Public Schools' Student Council.

The **Park Medical Group** donated \$2,000 to the Pascack Valley Meals on Wheels program. The medical practice selected the organization for its December Giving program. The program is designed to give back to the community by helping local organizations raise funds and awareness. In addition to the donation, physicians and staff from the medical practice donated their time to deliver meals to the program's recipients.

International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 164 recently collected more than \$5,000 worth of new, unwrapped gifts to benefit the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots Program.

The **National Multiple Sclerosis Society of Paramus** received \$20,000 to develop a Wellness Center in collaboration with the Kessler Institute for Rehabilitation. The donation is a part of a nearly \$2 million grant from the board of trustees of the Kessler Foundation to benefit people with physical disabilities.
